

CHAMBER ICE CREAM SOCIAL



Economic Development

ECONOMIC SNAPSHOT

In 2024, Heber Valley's economy remained relatively stable. Some of the growth factors we saw in previous years were much more limited. Tax collections from consumer spending such as sales, restaurant, and transient room taxes saw modest single-digit growth. Our experience in Wasatch County is reflective of the state of Utah. Most counties reported similar findings Additionally, unemployment remains relatively low at 3.5% despite a small 2.7 percent reduction in the number of jobs in the county. The tourism sector saw the largest loss in jobs at some 350, while trades and construction added more positions over the past 12 months. Efforts to stimulate the economy, especially in the Heber City downtown, stalled. However, in Midway City, we saw more growth around the Town Square with the addition of new stores surrounding the area. In 2024, the Deer Valley East Village was finally named, and the Grand Hyatt Deer Valley opened its doors to guests in November. Construction in that area is still on track to have a full opening of ski lifts and runs for the winter of 2025/2026.



WASATCH BACK ECONOMIC SUMMIT

The 2024 Zions Bank Wasatch Back Economic Summit, held at the Grand Summit Hotel, was a comprehensive regional event in collaboration with Heber Valley Chamber, Park City Chamber, Heber City, Park City Municipal, Wasatch County, and Summit County. The Summit brought together experts, leaders, and community stakeholders to explore critical topics shaping the region's future. With keynote speaker Robert Spendlove from Zions Bank, the event featured diverse breakout sessions on transportation, affordable housing, economic growth, workforce development, and tourism marketing, highlighting challenges and opportunities for the Wasatch Back. Attendees gained insights into leveraging AI, understanding legislative impacts, and fostering sustainable economic practices. The summit provides a collaborative platform to address the evolving needs of the community, economy, and workforce, ensuring a vibrant and thriving Wasatch Back region.

MINORITY INCLUSION

The Heber Valley Chamber advanced initiatives to support minority business owners and professionals. The new *Growing Together Mixers*, held three times this year, saw increasing attendance and fostered meaningful connections with Latino entrepreneurs. These events featured translators and Spanish-language website access to promote inclusivity. Partnering with the Utah Hispanic Chamber, we aim to expand these efforts further. Additionally, we collaborated with the Utah LGBTQ+ Chamber and Park City Chamber to host a *Wind Down Wednesday Mixer* at Encircle Heber, bringing together a great mix of professionals. The event's success has inspired plans for another collaboration in the spring of 2025, underscoring our dedication to inclusion and community development.

HEBER CITY PLAZA DESIGN

In 2024, Heber City continued to roll out the city's Envision 2050 plan. Partnering with Heber City, we helped study ideas and opportunities to revitalize the downtown. Our office secured grant funding from the state to bring in Roger Brooks, a destination development expert, to help us design and plan a community gathering area within Main Street Park. Additionally, we studied the downtown business mix, including ways to attract local shops to the downtown area. We also studied downtown parking overlays to create a cohesive parking strategy for the entire downtown area. From the plans created, we'll be able to continue to attract new and existing businesses to the downtown.

WASATCH BACK BUSINESS UNIVERSITY

New this year, we partnered with the Park City Chamber and Visitors Bureau to offer the first-ever Wasatch Back Business University (WBBU). This is a free benefit for members from either chamber to get quality business education and training. WBBU provides networking opportunities and insightful information to help businesses succeed. This program represents a growing partnership between our chambers as we strive to help Wasatch Back businesses thrive. Classes are monthly and alternate between Summit and Wasatch Counties making them convenient to attend.
